# AHTCA SPECIAL MEETING - 1/12/2022

### AGENDA

Matters discussed were as follows and agreement was unanimous unless stated otherwise:

• Opening

The meeting was conducted via Zoom hook-up and was opened by Mr Jervis Ward, who welcomed all members present to the Special meeting, which was agreed at the Committee meeting of 14 November 2022 to be called before the end of 2022 to finalise the three matters to be discussed at this Special meeting.

### **AHTCA Constitution**

The Committee noted that the revised AHTCA constitution was lodged by Mr Jervis Ward with Consumer Affairs Victoria on 24 November 2022 with amendments approved by the Committee covering the following:

- State based representation
- Duality of State based Clubs.

The Committee also noted that the reimbursement to Mr Jervis Ward of the associated fee of \$191.10 occurred on 26 November 2022.

### **QLD** representation on AHTCA

The Committee noted that the correspondence agreed by the Committee and as shown below was:

- issued on 14 November 2022 to a total of 90 QLD Group N competitors;
- the list of 90 intended recipients was checked with Mr Ciccotelli for accuracy on 22 October 2022, and that all AHTCA Committee members were copied in to that correspondence on the same date;
- due to a technical issue with the first attempt, re-issued on 17 November 2022 to the same intended recipient audience of 90; and;
- that this Special meeting to discuss the result was agreed at the Committee meeting of 14 November 2022.

I am writing to you as the current Australian Historic Touring Cars Association (AHTCA) representative for Queensland.
The AHTCA is a national body, exclusively for the Group N historic motor racing category.
<ul> <li>The AHTCA:</li> <li>Presents a national profile for Group N in Australia;</li> <li>Develops and maintains an annual National Calendar for Group N in Australia;</li> <li>Assists with the compliance of Group N cars across Australia;</li> <li>Represents a national view of eligibility and vehicle specification matters for Group N Historic Touring cars in Australia;</li> </ul>
Liaises with Motorsport Australia's Historic Based Eligibility Committee (HPBEC) about Group N .
HRCC QLD is currently the only nominated Club representing Queensland on the AHTCA. This is because it was the only Club from Queensland that existed when the AHTCA was formed.
Queensland now has two Clubs that have Group N members:         • the Queensland Historic Touring Cars Association (Group N only); and
• the Historic Racing Car Club of Queensland (all Historic Groups).
Because QHTCA also exists now, the AHTCA will be changing our Constitution to allow either Club to represent Queensland's Group N competitors under the "one vote per State" rule that is in the Constitution.
I am writing to you now to seek your vote as to which Queensland based Club should represent all Queensland Group N competitors on the AHTCA for 2023.

In total, the vote was:

- HRCC QLD 23
- QHTCA 27

The Committee agreed that;

- 1. The process undertaken is in accordance with paragraph 6.1 of the AHTCA constitution;
- 2. the voting method and results are valid;
- 3. the majority of votes indicated that the QHTCA is the successful contender;
- 4. the Constitution of the QHTCA satisfies the requirement that Group N is the primary focus of that Club, as evidenced below:

## 3 Objects

The objects of the association are-

(1) To promote the sport of historic touring car racing in Queensland;

(2) To organise or promote opportunities for historic touring car competitors to race in Queensland and inter-state;

- (3) To establish and administer race series for historic touring cars in Queensland;
- (4) To encourage the maintenance and development of historic touring cars;
- (5) To promote safe driving standards;
- (6) To provide social opportunities for historic touring car competitors;
- (7) To organise or promote motor sport related activities; and
- (8) To participate with other groups in furtherance of the above stated objects.

5. the Secretary of the AHTCA is now to write to the Presidents of both QHTCA and HRCC QLD:

- a. advising the result of the election;
- b. inviting a written nomination from the QHTCA containing the name and contact details of their preferred representative on the AHTCA for 2023.

### Use of Facebook

The Committee agreed that Facebook is to be used judiciously and that contact with AHTCA State representatives should be the first option.

### AHTCA Website

The Committee was provided with the prospective new AHTCA website on 26 November 2022. Feedback was received from Messrs Ward, Dennis and Blyfield and subsequent improvements were made.

The Committee agreed that:

- 1. this website can now be placed into production and be ready for 2023;
- invoices from the developer iDesign for the establishment costs of \$3,500 can now be received and paid (noting that one invoice for \$2,000 is to be issued to the Secretary of HTCANSW in order to validate the legitimate expenditure of the grant from NSW Sport, and the other invoice for \$1,500 is to be issued to the Secretary of the AHTCA);
- 3. invoices to AHTCA Clubs also be issued as follows:

The Committee noted that the HTCAV contribution will be:

- a net \$550;
- their initial contribution of \$1,500 will enable the AHTCA website to go live before 1 January 2023 and while the other AHTCA Club contributions are being collected; and
- that as contributions from other AHTCA Club members are received, HTCAV will be refunded to that effect;
- 4. The introduction of the new AHTCA website be publicised through the issuance of a special AHTCA electronic Newsletter prior to 1 January 2023 (Edition 12), wording of which is to be developed by the Secretary and approved by the AHTCA Committee;

- 5. Ongoing costs of \$1,440 for the website maintenance fee will be covered by sponsorship, the funds from the sponsor will need to be in place by 1 January 2023, and that this matter is in the hands of Mr Jervis Ward.
- 6. The matter of having a Facebook page for AHTCA is to be examined.

### National Calendar

AHTCA Committee members will provide their respective racing calendar dates for 2023 to the Secretary of the AHTCA before 1 January 2023 so that the national calendar can be placed on the new AHTCA website.

The AHTCA will then continue to work on a national marketing and promotion plan for the national calendar.

### General Business

The next meeting of the AHTCA will be a Committee meeting, and will be held on 17 January 2023.
