# Minimum weights



The revised list is on the **AHTCA** website here...

It is still open to further feedback if anyone has credible documentation for a better kerb weight – just go to your state EO with that evidence and AHTCA will see that it gets considered by the HPBEC.

## **Planning**



The AHTCA is developing a 5 year plan for Historic Touring cars.

We want the category to keep growing and we want to plan accordingly. Although only in the early stages, there are some good ideas being thrown about. As we progress we will, of course, share it with everyone.

#### Approval of a Lexan windscreen



Current rules state:

"Windscreen: A laminated windscreen is required in races and in multiple car speed events. However, in the event that a laminated screen is unavailable, approval may be given on individual application to Motorsport Australia for the fitment of a Lexan or Perspex windscreen"

This has happened for a Jaguar Mark 1 (Nb) owner

# **Protruding wheels and tyres**



It had come to the EOs attention that some competitors cars have got a little pumped in the wheel arch and track areas.

Just be aware EOs will be focusing on that because some vehicles are getting out of control.

## **Fire Extinguishers**



Following investigations into several incidents at Circuit Race Events at all levels of the sport, Motorsport Australia will be mandating the fitment of fire extinguishers for all Automobiles in Circuit Races.

Approved Hand-held extinguishers are either 1 kg (minimum) Australian Standard 1841.5 ABE Powder or an FIA standard handheld extinguisher.

Hand-held extinguishers must be installed in accordance with Motorsport Australia Manual, Technical Appendix, Schedule H.

An AS1841 ABE Powder extinguisher must be serviced or replaced every 3 years.

#### **Rev limiters**



From 1/1/24, for any vehicle where a rev limiter has been specified in the spec sheet, the limiter must be located within the engine bay in an easily accessible position.

The wiring must be visible along its length with the earth connected to the nearest practical earth point.

The limiter will be subject to testing at race meetings

#### **Fuel Tanks**



Use of poly plastic fuel tanks is not a good idea and are likely to be banned in the future.

They don't do well in an accident – better to go with the highly recommended foam-filled fuel tank, or a fuel tank of a safety type approved by the FIA to FT3 specifications
